THE WOMENS' CLINIC

The Access Place is a "one stop shop" offering support to people experiencing homelessness who have additional needs.

We understand the importance of having a safe space for women where they can seek and receive good health care. The 'women only clinic' is run by women for women including transgender women/people.

The clinic offers women a variety of care including access to wider services.



The clinic runs every Thursday afternoon from 2.30pm to 4.30pm.

Appointments can be arranged through reception staff or by contacting us by telephone. You will need to make an appointment to attend the clinic, although we do our best to make space for on the day slots whenever possible.

You can use the main entrance to access the clinic or alternatively you can use the accessible entrance to the left of the building which is staffed by women.

On arrival you will be shown to a women's only waiting area (separate from the main waiting area) where you will meet with a member of the team.

If you would prefer to have someone accompany you to your appointments, for example a family member, friend or support worker please let us know. The clinic, however, is a safe place for women so please be aware if you arrive with a male support, he will be asked to wait in the main waiting area.

The clinic has a range of professionals working within it and you will have the opportunity to talk with them. Please let us know what you need help with and we will guide you to the most appropriate person.


The Access Place has many other services including housing, social work and welfare benefits advice. You are welcome to ask about these at reception.
